Absent: Chris Androy. Visitors: two visitors, then three arriving at 5:15 p.m. City Clerk Mary Poort was also present and reminded Council of the two handouts: final draft of Malvern City Zoning Ordinances and SOCS Website Developer Promotional for future consideration. McGann motioned to approve the agenda as written. Breeding seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

Public Hearing – Proposed FY19 Budget Amendment #2 for the City of Malvern, Iowa: Mayor Blackburn called to order the public hearing at 5:01 p.m. Blackburn recognized that the Notice of the City Council's Intent to Conduct a Public Hearing on the Proposed FY19 Budget Amendment #2 for the City of Malvern, Iowa had been published May 16, 2019, in the *Malvern Leader*. City Clerk Poort reported there were no written objections, statements, and/or evidence heretofore filed at City Hall prior to the hearing. Whereupon, Blackburn opened the floor for any objections, statements, and/or exhibits for Council consideration. There being no objections, comments, or evidence offered, the Mayor closed the public hearing at 5:01 p.m.

Public Hearing – Proposal to Dispose of Real Estate Owner by the City of Malvern, Iowa: Mayor Blackburn called to order the public hearing at 5:02 p.m. Blackburn recognized that Notice of the City Council's Intent to Conduct a Public Hearing on the City Council's intent to Dispose of Real Estate Owned by the City of Malvern, Iowa, had been published May 16, 2019, in the *Malvern Leader*. City Clerk Poort reported there were no written objections, statements, and/or evidence heretofore filed at City Hall prior to the hearing. Whereupon, Blackburn opened the floor for any objections, statements, and/or exhibits for Council consideration. Shere motioned to approve RESOLUTION 2019-21 – **Authorizing the Sale of City Property and Authorizing the Mayor/Pro-Tempore, and City Clerk to Complete Process.** McGann seconded. All ayes; motion carried. Two visitors exited the meeting.

Shere motioned to approve RESOLUTION 2019-19 **Adopting City of Malvern Procurement Policy to be in Compliance with Federal Guidelines Applicable to Federal Grants.** Johnson seconded. All ayes; Motion carried.

Shere motioned to approve Casey's General Store's Retail Cigarette/Tobacco/Nicotine/Vapor Permit. Breeding seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

McGann motioned to identify a **co-zoning official** along with Bob Blum to alleviate any conflicts of interest in approving Malvern City Building Permits. Johnson seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

Mayor Blackburn recognized Cisco Shere, **Council Appeal** regarding nuisance abatement, BLK 37/LOT 12E of RR, Cisco's Service, junk/junk vehicles. Mr. Shere talked from a handout provided to Council. Discussion was held. Mayor Blackburn appointed an Ad Hoc Committee to work with Cisco's Service to develop a plan of action—Johnson and Breeding. Johnson motioned to provide a month's extension. Shere seconded. All ayes; motion carried. Shere family exited at 5:54 p.m.

Johnson motioned to approve **Heritage Town Center performance slab** and Wabash Trace/ Main Street Intersection **bike sculpture mounting slab(s)** to be poured along with approved cement work at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Main. Breeding seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

**Nuisance Abatement** matters on May 13<sup>th</sup>'s Council List and new items were discussed. Breeding will finalize his nuisance concerns and send by email. Androy's email concern on Marion Avenue parking was recognized. McGann provided a list of concerns and exited the meeting at 6:05 p.m. with Breeding providing a motion to adjourn. Blackburn adjourned the meeting to continue non-action work with the Ad Hoc Committee on about ten nuisance abatement issues until 6:39 p.m.
